Summer: Toronto: Five-day daytime studio gig for CBC-TV. Three days were with Dizzy Reese's group, with John Gilmore, John Hicks, Ali Jackson, and Charli Persip. For the other two, the band backed Jimmy Witherspoon for "Sixty Minutes with Spoon," produced by Darrell Duke. Rehearsals preceded the Witherspoon taping. At night, Adams and Hicks jammed with local musicians, including one evening with Sonny Greenwich.

Summer: Toronto: Lionel Hampton gig at The Friars. Jimmy Owens is in the band.

cSummer: New York?: Adams does a three-week tour with Maynard Ferguson's Big Band. He replaces Frank Hittner and precedes Ronnie Cuber in the band.

cJuly: New York: Wednesday night concert in the garden of St. Mark's Church-in-the-Bouwerie featuring Adams's and Booker Ervin's groups.

July 18–31: New York: Lionel Hampton gig at Metropole.

late July: New York: Adams joins Pony Poindexter for a Monday night gig at Birdland.

Aug 1–3: New York: Lionel Hampton gig at Metropole. See 18–31 July.

early August: New York: Charles Mingus gig at Village Gate, with Richard Williams, Eddie Preston, Eric Dolphy, Booker Ervin, Pepper Adams, Garnett Brown, Don Butterfield, Joe Albany, Charles Mingus, Dannie Richmond.

Sept 25: Bronx NY: Adams attends Giants football game at Yankee Stadium, possibly with Thad Jones.

Oct 6: Detroit: Adams attends Lions–49ers football game at Tiger Stadium.

Dec 4: New York: Adams's tenth date as leader, for Motown, playing four Thad Jones arrangements. Personnel: Thad Jones, Jerry Dodgion, Quentin Jackson, Jerome Richardson, Roland Hanna, George Duvivier, and Grady Tate.

Dec 24–25: Los Angeles: Off.

cDec 26–30: Los Angeles: Possible Lionel Hampton gigs.

Dec 31: Hollywood CA: Adams plays church dance with Lee Katzman, and a rhythm section that includes pianist Bob Florence.

1964

Feb 1–29: Southern US: String of 31 Lionel Hampton one-nighters continues, including a gig at Longhorn Ranch in Dallas. See late Jan 1964.

Mar 9–15: Detroit: Pepper Adams gig at Drome Lounge, with Terry Pollard Trio.

Mar 16–28: New York: Lionel Hampton gig at Metropole. Jimmy Owens and Garnett Brown are in the band.

cApril: New York: Gigs with Basin Street East house band, backing shows for popular singers such as Peggy Lee and Vic Damone. Snooky Young, Thad Jones, Danny Stiles, Clark Terry, Jerome Richardson, Roland Hanna, Richard Davis, and Ray Mosca are in the band.

cApril: Hartford: Adams gig at Delisa's, with the rhythm section of Bruce Martin, Fred Tinsley, and Eddie Marshall.

cApril: Boston: Adams works a 6-night engagement at Jazz Workshop, with Frank Foster and the rhythm section of Ray Santisi and most likely John Neves and Joe Hunt.

May 3: New York: Off.

May 4–5: West Peabody MA: Lionel Hampton gig at Wagon Wheels.

May 21: Port Huron MI: Adams sits in with Bob Pierson Quartet at Twilight Lounge.

late May: New York: Lionel Hampton gig at World's Fair Custom Car Cavalcade.

June 1–7: Possible Lionel Hampton gigs between New York and Las Vegas.

June 8–14: Stateline NV: Lionel Hampton gig at Harvey's Wagon Wheel.

cSept: Atlantic City NJ: Adams works a couple of weeks backing shows, including one week with comedian Milton Berle.

cSept: unknown: Adams possibly works a week or two with Lloyd Price Band.
